OUR COMMITMENT TO UNITED NATIONS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



In 2015, the United Nations member states agreed on an ambitious and universal agenda, adopting 17 Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs), in response to the growing global awareness of the need to shift towards a more sustainable and equitable future.

The UN SDGs aim to create a better future for everyone regardless of race, gender, age, or socio-economic status by focusing on core pillars of sustainable development: eradicating poverty, ensuring access to quality education, promoting good health and well-being, and creating sustainable communities. This framework is structured in such a way that invites all types of entities from governments and businesses to individuals and society at large to respond to the economic, social, and environmental challenges of the day.

At Hunt, we embrace the opportunity to positively contribute to UN SDGs through our initiatives and operations around the world. Some of our contributions to date include:



 Implementing community engagement projects to combat malnutrition in impoverished communities of Peru, such as Haku Wiñay in partnership with the National Fund for Compensation and Social Development (FONCODES)



- Prioritizing the health and safety of our employees across global operations through industry-grade Health, Safety, Social & Environment (HSSE) programming
- Providing comprehensive health & wellbeing initiatives to our employees
- Promoting social projects to improve health infrastructure and services in rural communities of the Kurdistan region of Iraq and Peru



- Providing training to public school teachers in Peru to improve the quality of education to children who reside in urban and rural areas near Hunt operations
- In collaboration with public and private organizations in Romania, the Kurdistan region of Iraq, and West Texas:
 - Developing infrastructure and equipment for schools and universities
 - Providing training for teachers to improve the reading, writing, and math skills in students of low-income families
- Offering economic support to young people for the completion of basic education along with access to tertiary education



- Facilitating the storage and efficient use of water for consumption and agricultural purposes in remote, rural areas of Peru and the Kurdistan Region of Iraq
- Improving the sanitary conditions for more than 2,300 families since 2009 and advancing wastewater treatment in alliance with local authorities since 2012



- Reducing our carbon footprint by providing natural gas, a cleaner source of energy, in diverse markets
- Investing in new renewable energy technologies and projects
- Continuing investment in the improvement of our internal processes, company facilities and technologies to drive production efficiencies



- Hiring locally and providing employment opportunities in safe and secure working environments with competitive salaries
- Assisting our contractors in the improvement of their skills and contributing to their competitive advantage in the workforce
- Using local suppliers
- Promoting social initiatives in neighboring communities in the Kurdistan region and Peru that encourage the growth of micro and small enterprises



- Documenting the cultural heritage and caring of archaeological sites in areas close to our operations
- Contributing to the improvement and rehabilitation of public spaces, such as playground parks for children and their families in communities of Romania



- Measuring and understanding our global emissions and establishing operational controls to reduce methane emissions across the company in response
- Researching and investing in renewable technologies, including wind farm and battery technologies



- The installation of the breakwater at our PERU LNG marine facility has had a net positive impact on marine biodiversity in the area. Monitoring of the marine biodiversity continues and involves local fisherman participation and the utilization of national and international marine specialists.
- Generating scientific knowledge based on biodiversity monitoring data shared with the global scientific community



- Establishing standards and procedures for the management and monitoring of biodiversity with the participation of local communities
- Promoting scientific research to increase national and international knowledge of Andean biodiversity. Including the discovery of a new species
- Partnering with local consultants and internationally recognized specialists in biodiversity management, such as the Smithsonian Institute

- Partnering with NGOs, academia and diverse public and private organizations in the promotion of sustainable social and environmental initiatives in the countries where we operate

Working together to reduce anemia in Peru


Anemia is a public health concern that impacts a person's physical and mental health and development, especially in children. In PERU LNG, in alliance with Caritas (NGO) and local health centers, PERU LNG has provided:

- Training workshops on how to prepare iron-rich meals for mothers of rural communities
- Monitoring of hemoglobin levels in young children in more than 250 families
- Hygiene kits and filter equipment for drinking water





The health and well-being of the people



- Training on preparing healthy meals, food hygiene, and managing resources.
- Kitchen utensils and installation of vegetable gardens to continue servicing >400 people.



Revitalizing community spaces in Romania

Community playgrounds offer a multitude of benefits beyond aesthetics. They are the heart of a community and an indispensable gathering space. In 2022, Hunt financed:

- Renovation of the central playground of the Ulmu community in Braila County, used by more than 250 children.
- Construction of a new playground park for the children and families of the Buzau county.
- Donation of sports equipment and supplies for 350 children that play handball in Braila County. Handball is the number one sport in the county and some of the children compete in the Romanian Handball Federation's official championship.

Donating to Ukrainian refugees in Romania

Provided both financial and material donations to the NGO's Save the Children and Foundation for SMURD (Mobile Emergency Service for Resuscitation and Extrication) to help refugee Ukrainian families arriving in Romania with very little.

The education of the school population and access to higher education for youth

Improving math skills

In alliance with Asociación Matemática Peru and the Ministry of Education, more than 1,000 students were trained in new ways to carry out mathematical calculations. The teachers also received training on new methodologies and online platforms to better engage students.



Constructing a new school in Kurdistan

Children previously walked for miles under unsafe conditions or paid for transportation (which most families cannot afford) to attend school in surrounding villages. Hunt financed the construction of a new school in Kurdistan to serve ~230 1st-8th grade children



Improving Romanian school conditions

In Braila County, a new heating system was installed at the Ciocile Gymnasium School to improve the study conditions for 118 students.



Teaching English to Shekhan youth

A month-long, mediumlevel English course was provided to 80 members of the local youth center by the NGO, Armand, This Huntfinanced initiative will not only drive academic success but open doors to new employment opportunities available to English speakers.




Supporting local school children in Romania

75 children in the Padina and Rusetu communities who are at risk of dropping out of school due to a lack of resources received packages of clothes and school supplies to support them to continue studying. Periodical meetings with parents and their children are held to explain the importance of school in the children's lives

Training Shekhan women to drive in Kurdistan In a survey conducted by the

Youth Center of Shekhan, many participants, mostly women, expressed their need to learn how to drive so they can drive back and forth to their work or transport their children to school. A three-week course was provided to 15 women in Shekhan to help them gain the skills and confidence to drive automobiles.





22+ teachers and 600 students from 13 public schools received table tennis training to support cognitive development and reinforce skills including discipline, concentration, speed of thought, handeye-mind coordination and teamwork.







Installation of a power generator in Dorishan, Kurdistan

The generator provides 24-hour access to electricity for more than 130 families, including the continuous operation of the water well pump that provides drinking and irrigation water to the community. Previously, access to electricity was limited.





Efficient water

Improving agriculture in Kurdistan villages

The Shekhan district economy primarily depends on the agricultural sector, and over 35% of its 140,000 inhabitants derive their livelihoods from farming and farming-related activities. The following initiatives were carried out to improve access to water for irrigation and the productivity of crops grown by farmers in the Shekahn district and Baadre district:

- · Provided high-quality fertilizers and training sessions on application methods to 14 farmers responsible for over 214 acres of land near the Galikhudedah village. The aim was to improve farming businesses and bolster competitiveness with imported goods.
- Drilled a water well in Shkeftyan village to irrigate more than 123 acres of land. Providing water to 30 farmers to irrigate their land, as needed, enabling the growth of vegetables and more than once harvest a year.
- Installed power lines to connect water wells to the national power grid. This enabled more than 50 farmers in the villages of Galikhudedah and Esyan villages to access water for the irrigation of nearly 200 acres







The local economic development and the care of the cultural heritage

A veterinarian campaign in Kurdistan

A veterinarian campaign that encouraged vaccination contributed to preventing several fatal diseases that could harm both animals and humans in the Kurdistan region. Protecting livestock, which is one of the main pillars of Shekhan's economy, encourages the population to continue their livestock businesses. Additionally, vaccinations lead to healthy meat and dairy products that will ultimately be consumed by the local population. A similar project was conducted in 2018 with great success according to Shekhan Dept. of Agriculture report.



Supporting City Hall traditions in Romania

Padina City Hall is a cultural hub often showcasing popular dances and songs, specific to Southeast Romania, Hunt supports this piece of Padina culture through donation of traditional garments for the use of dancers during their presentations.



A program that started in 2012 continues to provide technical assistance to local government authorities in preparing technical files for implementing public projects such as the construction of schools, health centers, and more. During 2022, six district municipalities of Ayacucho, Huancavelica, and Ica received specialized training from Universidad del Pacifico, our partner for the implementation of the program.



Investing in local artisan women in Peru

60 women from the regions of Ayacucho and Huancavelica (among the lowest-income regions in Peru) continue to receive training on how to prepare alpaca fiber for better quality products and receive technical assistance on reaching new markets for their businesses.
